Anne Tatum called the meeting to order at 5:36 p.m.

Motion for the September Meeting Minutes approval was made by Judy Humphreyson and a second motion was made by Lisa Armstrong. All approved and the motion was passed.

Brandy Osterberger – report on Fundraiser

From Brandy: We are in the midst of planning our big **MARDI GRAS @ New Tech** again this year. It was a huge success 2 years ago and we decided to take it on every other year. The original idea grew from a Geometry project, and I would like to have the learners work through that project again. Although, I will need help from some of YOU! We will be designing “quilt” blocks. The learners are individually responsible for one block. They cut their designs out of material and the blocks are sewn together to create a blanket or “quilt”. The Mardi Gras fundraiser will be in February; however the day is to be determined. If you would like to donate money or items, there are tax deductible forms available at New Tech. The first year all money was donated to Children’s Medical. This year there will be a live and silent auction and the fundraiser will benefit New Tech and Habitat for Humanity.

Treasurer’s Report

- ▶ In Dana Shay’s absence, Tara Krieg reported cash on hand of \$23,214 (Financials are attached).
- ▶ As of October 3rd, Write-A-Check has contributed \$12,340.

The audit committee has completed the audit for the past 2 years. The committee consisting of the Kristy Racz V.P., Tara Krieg Member-at-Large and Sherri Waddey Faculty Member found all monies have been accounted for. Tara Krieg will chair the Gifts-to-School Committee as Assistant Treasurer, along with Tabitha Branum as **NTH@C** Director, Dana Shay as treasurer, Anne Tatum as PTSO president and Judy Humphreyson as the Member-at-large. There will be changes to the Bylaws needed for both the Audit Committee and the Gifts-to-School Committee. If anyone has any other bylaw change suggestions, please let Anne know.

LLC Update

- ▶ Maggie Gross and Dat Ho reported on the Community Service Project – Habitat for Humanity floor plans are underway.
- ▶ During the month of October the networking groups are preparing for the Fall Festival at the end of October. These groups are designing booths and working together to create an old fashion carnival for everyone to enjoy! The center piece of the Fall Festival is the Punkin’ Chunkin’ Contest. New Tech and CHS will design the catapults for the pumpkins! Tickets are available the night of the event.

Director's Update

- ▶ Tabitha talked about the SAT/ACT scores for 2010. They were the highest since 2000. **SAT's were up 6% over the year 2000 and ACT increased 11% from 2000**. Results were taken from CHS only. New Tech will have scores for our first graduating class next year, although, Tabitha reported New Tech learners scored very high on the ACT! Some NT students are still taking/retaking their SAT to increase their scores.
- ▶ With regard to test scores, Tabitha discussed a rumor that has circulated in reference to New Tech students not passing any AP tests and hiring a consultant from Florida. This is completely false! It is true that New Tech didn't fair as well with the AP exams, however, this exam is a memorization of facts and not higher level conceptual learning. New Tech requires a higher order thinking and real world application. These are optional exams and not required by colleges. For those kids who are interested in taking the AP exams, New Tech will now offer a study skills course. New Tech charges the actual cost of the exam to our students.
- ▶ **Rotary Club students of the month from New Tech are Riley Braun sand Sag Patel**. They are both exceptional students and role-models. They are being honored for their contribution to charitable organizations! Congratulations!
- ▶ Please help me congratulate **Shehyrar Siddiqui and Luke Williamson for their National Merit Candidate qualification**. In addition, we have **6 National Commended Scholars**. These individuals include **Juliana Brassfield, Prabu Devadas, Jacob Lewis, Nikko Racz, Laura Lisbona, and Kristin Miller**. I am so proud of each and every one of these individuals. It takes so much hard work and effort outside of the school day to be prepared for this test! Congratulations to all of you!
- ▶ Community Service/Outreach - **Chain of Hope** was started at New Tech as a way to join schools to honor Reggie Garrett. New Tech, CHS and Guyer HS all joined together the Chain of Hope and it will be given to Reggie's family.
- ▶ Tabitha plans to have "**Directors Dialog**" feedback sessions with 10 to 15 1st and 2nd year New Tech parents. These parents will be able to ask questions directly to Tabitha on issues they are interested in learning more about. Please look for the am and pm session days and times in HotSync.
